
CHALLENGE

As of December 2021, only 1.6% (75,028) of the Haitian population had received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine, one of the lowest in the region. Rumors about the vaccine and cultural taboos in addition to weaknesses of the health system have seriously affected vaccination efforts.

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

A Multilayer and Evolving Approach



To ensure continued availability of vaccine, ISPD provided logistic support to the Ministry of Health including transportation and delivery of stock of vaccines in remote areas. We gradually integrated COVID-19 vaccine into routine immunization at the supported health facilities.

oOoU **RESULTS/OUTCOMES**



From January 2022 to June 2023, 300,038 individuals were sensitized. A total of 11394 individuals (52% males and 48% females) received their first dose (Moderna 14%, Pfizer 17%, Jansen 69%); of which 9859 (87%) are considered fully immunized.

APPLICATION TO ROUTINE IMMUNIZATION OR PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

This multilayer, multifaceted and proactive approach has resulted in an increase in number of individuals vaccinated and shown the importance of constantly adapting implementation strategies according to patients' needs.
